







The average adult blinks 15 to 20 times per minute.

The smallest skeletal muscle in the human body is just a couple of millimetres in size. It's called..



The stapes is the smallest bone in the body. The stapedius protects the inner ear from loud noises; it also helps to stop our voice from sounding too loud in our head. If the facial nerve is damaged the stapedius muscle may not work properly and loud noises are not dampened adequately.
